2016 was filled with informal consultation events to help our preparation of the Ticehurst Parish Wide Neighbourhood Plan. The focal point of the December event was visualisations of changes to the streets and public spaces. These photomontage images used a combination of measures aimed at reducing speeds, discouraging through-traffic, and increasing driver awareness of the built environment. The concepts would also reduce highway signage and clutter, including painted lines, and draw out the existing qualities of the parish, much of which is within a Conservation Area.

Since holding the December event, we have received lots of feedback on the work in progress. There was a mixed reaction, with some residents concerned about whether the proposed changes to roads would be effective, and highlighting other issues they felt had not been addressed. However, most respondents were generally very supportive of the concepts and ideas.
