

Neighbourhood Planning Meeting Steering Group Meeting 6.30 p.m. 31st October 2016 The Village Institute, Ticehurst.

Minutes of 8.9.16 - were agreed with the addition of survey discussion.

Report to go to Parish Council for resolution on 1.11.16 was agreed.

Sedlescombe Support: S Barrass explained that due to the D. Cllrs. voting against the emerging NP policy at Sedlescombe and officer recommendation, Sedlescombe are applying to the Sec. of State to overturn the decision to grant planning on Street Farm. It was unanimously agreed that Ticehurst should support their position.

Policy Development: Policy web site pages were displayed and requests were made (to be posted to the site) for comment on each of the 22 topics shown.

Feria will be at the Village Hall from Thursday lunch time to Friday lunch time giving presentations throughout the day and evening. Additional displays of information are being organised by the steering Group in the Village Square, Ticehurst Church, Stonegate and Flimwell – each group are making their own arrangements and should request display boards and stationery. It was resolved to request 300 A5 booklets from Feria, in addition to the A1 posters and flyers.

Engagement Activity: R Tait reported that the central pages of N & Vs are dedicated to the NP and can be removed easily. Shops, pubs, cafes, road side posters are advertising the events. It was felt that door knocking would achieve the best engagement. The web site is receiving between 25 – 40 hits per day and the email subscription list is growing.

T Killeen reported that a group to engage **younger persons** is currently being formed.

Parish Survey It was resolved that Feria should be asked to produce a survey covering all emerging policies that can be used to canvass the community – First week in January 2017 to reach regulation 14 by the end of January.

After the November consultation, groups will need to evaluate the input to work towards producing policy as guided by Feria.
